Herbert W. Rekeweg, 92, passed away Wednesday, Sept. 7, 2011, at Park Place Senior Living, Ft. Wayne. Born in Maumee Twp., he was the son of the late Fred and Frieda (Woebeking) Rekeweg. Herb was a lifelong member of Zion Lutheran Church, Woodburn, where he was active in the choir until he was ninety. He was a farmer and also enjoyed 20 years as a substitute rural mail carrier. He served many organizations including Allen County Co-op Board of Directors (25 years), Allen County Farm Bureau Board of Directors, Board of Directors of the Indiana District of The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, Woodburn Lutheran School Board, and the Woodburn Park Board .
