Virgil R. Hoepfner, 91, passed away Saturday, January 31, 2015, at Golden Years Homestead, Fort Wayne with his loving family by his side. Born in Fort Wayne, he was the son of the late Hilda (Waltke) Hoepfner. He was a member of Christ Lutheran Church, Woodburn. The US Army veteran served his country in World War II and was a member of American Legion Post 377 and Howard Bandelier Jr. VFW Post 2457. He retired in 1977 from International Harvester after 30 years. He volunteered at Parkview Hospital and also the VA Hospital for almost 20 years. He was also a member of the Indiana High School Basketball Hall of Fame.

He is survived by his children, Susan (John) Ehle of New Palestine, Robert (Nancy) Hoepfner, Richard (Naomi) Hoepfner, Norm (Jan) Hoepfner, and Brian (Karen) Hoepfner all of Woodburn; brother, Donald (Elsie) Hoepfner of Woodburn; 14 grandchildren; 20 great grandchildren; three step great grandchildren; and one step great great grandchild. He was preceded in death by his wife, Alice in 1988; brother, Gerald Hoepfner; grandson, Jeffrey Hoepfner; and special friend, Mary Dillon.
