She was a lifelong member of St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Fort Wayne. She graduated from Woodlan High School in 1975 and Indiana University School of Business, Bloomington in 1979. She worked for Marathon Oil in Findlay, Ohio then in Houston, Texas, traveling many times to the Middle East and England. She returned to Fort Wayne in 1994 and began working for Franklin Electric in 1995. She was manager of Internal Audit for all of Franklin Electric World Wide Locations, retiring in 2013. 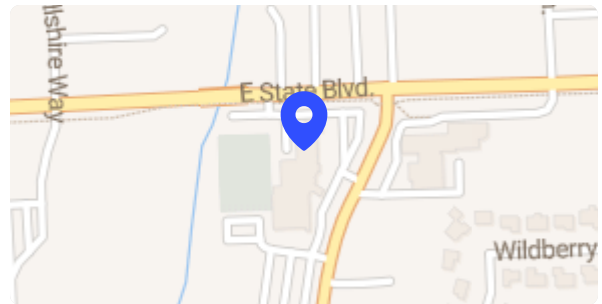

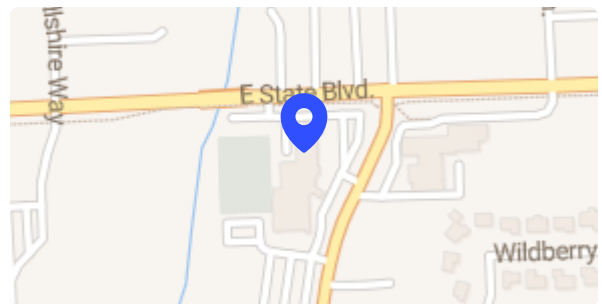
