Lloyd D. Urbine, 99, passed away Tuesday, July 4, 2017 at Towne House Retirement Center, Fort Wayne. Born on August 5, 1917 in Monroeville, he was the son of the late Oscar and Sophia (Martin) Urbine. He was a member of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, New Haven and the Holy Name Society. He served his country in the US Army Air Corp and went on to serve in the Air National Guard. He was also a member of the Reserve Officers Association. He retired in 1978 from International Harvester after 43 years.
